## Terms and Conditions

On-line access to the conference website will be available from 23 April through to 4 June 2012 and is only available to registered delegates with a UCL username and password. Access to the conference website is restricted via UCL Moodle (UCL's on-line learning environment).

Usernames and passwords for the conference website are issued with the explicit agreement that these are for personal use by the registered delegate only and are not to be shared with others. UCL will monitor the login behaviour of usernames to the conference website and reserves the right to suspend or deny access to any username that starts to appear on an unusual number of IP addresses.

Registered delegates should not share viewing of the website with others without the written consent of the symposium directors.

Lectures can be viewed via the conference website but it will not be possible to download recordings. Lectures may be viewed by the registered delegate any number of times until 4<sup>th</sup> June 2012.

Lectures will be filmed, edited and broadcast by UCL Media Services. Lectures will be broadcast via a live stream on the web and available to view again within approximately 5-6 hours of the lecture. We will endeavour to deliver but cannot guarantee the successful live-streaming of lectures. We guarantee that recordings will be available.

It is the responsibility of each registered delegate to ensure they have computing and broadband internet facilities capable of viewing the lecture files. We strongly recommend delegates check that they can view examples of UCL media file recordings here- <http://www.ucl.ac.uk/popfootprints/archived-videos> Please note that live-streaming is more vulnerable to interruption due to poor internet connection compared to recordings.

Some lecturers may request that recordings of clinical patients or sensitive data are not presented via the website. If the Lecturer makes such a request for particular materials then those materials will not be shown on the web and instead the camera will focus on the lecturer only.

All delegates who have poster abstracts accepted will need to submit their posters in JPEG format to Amanda Kosinski [a.kosinski@ucl.ac.uk](mailto:a.kosinski@ucl.ac.uk) by 23 March 2012. Posters will be displayed on the conference website and therefore delegates may take electronic snapshots of your posters. Delegates who register for on-line only access will have their posters displayed only on the conference website. Delegates who register to attend the ICH event in person will also display posters in the poster room at ICH.

Delegates who choose to contribute to discussions on the conference web forums must adhere to ethical rules of professional conduct and communication. The symposium directors reserve the right to refuse admission to web forums for unprofessional comments.

It should be possible to submit questions for the lecturer during live broadcasts but it is at the discretion of the session host whether he/she presents any submitted questions at appropriate points during or after the presentation for the lecturer to consider.

Delegates who choose to ask a lecturer a question in person within the ICH lecture Theatre are consenting to appear on the web output media files.
